### Position Summary:

We are seeking a Spanish-speaking per diem (8-10 hours/week) clinician to co-facilitate bereavement groups with school and community partners. This is on an as needed basis throughout the year for groups that run either 6-10 weeks consecutively or a group that runs periodically throughout the school year. This position is a member of the Program Team and will report directly to the Associate Program Director.

### Responsibilities:

- Coordinate school-based programming for Spanish speakers, including peer support groups and parent workshops in connection with school systems.
- Coordinate additional adjunct services for Spanish speakers in the community including a "Parenting While Grieving" series or a Family Night.
- Outreach to school and community-based organizations with goal of setting up short-term groups or one-time workshops
- Provide phone support in Spanish including information, crisis response, and community referrals to Spanish-speaking professionals, school and community personnel, and adult family members; complete all applicable documentation
- Participate in program staff meeting (when possible) as well as team meetings for planning school & community groups
- Participate in Facilitator training

### Qualifications:

- Must be completely bi-lingual (fluent) in Spanish and English in spoken and written form
- Familiarity with Latinx communities and experience working in those communities
- Knowledge of child development and experience working with school-aged children and teens
- Knowledge of bereavement and experience working with youth who are grieving
- 4-year college degree; Master's degree required in one of the following: Counseling Psychology, Social Work
- Ability to work well as part of a team
- Strong writing, analytical and problem-solving skills in Spanish and English
- Strong interpersonal skills and ability to interact effectively with a wide range of people
- Ability to be flexible and change direction quickly
- Excellent interpersonal skills and oral and written Spanish and English communication
- Excellent organizational and time management skills
- Demonstrated ability to manage confidential information with integrity and to maintain privacy requirements
- Ability to work on a flexible schedule as needed (occasional events or training on nights / morning or afternoon short-term groups needs)
- Sense of humor
- Commitment to the goals and values of The Children's Room
- While not absolute, a car is usually necessary for transportation
- Willingness to travel to various communities across Eastern Massachusetts
